Research Areas

Formal syntax: syntactic properties of Germanic (synchronic): coordinate structures, left-edge ellipsis, verb-second, left-displacement, and how these relate to second-language acquisition.
Language maintenance and shift: social and cultural assimilation in the North Dakota Germans from Russia and heritage Germans in Oklahoma, and how it relates to language maintenance and loss.
Heritage language: properties of German dialects or varieties spoken by individuals living outside of a German-speaking country, whether as an immigrant or descendant of an immigrant.
